Media 2007 - Final Initial Training Call (Uk) Media 2007 is intended to economically strengthen the audiovisual sector to enable it to play its cultural roles more effectively. The programme is to encourage exchanges and cooperation within the European audiovisual sector by providing support for networking amongst trainers across Europe - in particular, among institutes of higher education, training organisations, and their partners in the professional sector - to encourage the mobility of students and trainers in Europe.

Consortia of higher education institutes and/or organisations involved in the audiovisual sector are invited to apply. Consortia must consist of organisations from three participating countries, with a minimum of three higher education institutes.

Support is available for training activities taking place between 1 September 2011 and 30 June 2013 aimed at developing the capacity of future audiovisual professionals to understand and integrate the European dimension in their work, by improving their expertise in the following areas:

- training in economic, financial and commercial management;
- training in new technologies; and
- training in script development.

European Refugee Fund (2008-2013) (Uk) The UK Border Agency has issued a Call for Proposals under the European Refugee Fund 2010.

NGOs, charities, academic institutions, local government, intergovernmental organisations, limited companies and any partnership made up of these organisations can apply for projects lasting a maximum of three years. Project proposals from local, regional or national organisations will be considered in the following areas:

- Innovative refugee specific entry level English language provision, in particular the need to provide alternative or supplementary English language provision at an early stage which allows them to meet requirements for support.
- Innovative solutions to housing for newly granted refugees including housing support especially to allow independent living for refugees and entry into private housing sector accommodation.

The value of the fund available is approximately £1.8 million. The minimum ERF grant that can be applied for is £75,000 per year per project, and the maximum is restricted to £350,000 per year per project. The amount applied for must normally be matched 50:50 with funds from non-European Union sources, although projects which specifically target vulnerable groups including women, unaccompanied children, young people, elderly people or people with disabilities may be eligible for European Refugee Fund co-funding of up to 75%.
